Local implementation

- Statewide enrollment through web, paper and phone
 - Obvious bumps, changes in deadlines, etc.
- Local outreach and enrollment efforts
 - Non-profits - primarily AIDS Support Network and Community Health Centers
 - Private insurance agents
 - Department of Social Services
- ACA Planning Group and outreach subcommittee meet monthly

Local implementation

- Transition of County Medical Services Program (CMSP) to Medically Indigent Services Program (MISP)
 - Over ¾ of CMSP patients are expected to transition to Medi-Cal
 - Most of remainder expected to receive subsidized coverage through Covered California
 - MISP will cover those legal residents above the Medi-Cal limits with a medical need who cannot "afford" Covered California coverage, or those with a hardship waiver. These new criteria to begin April 1, 2014.
 - Applications to be processed by DSS.

Local implementation

- New Mental Health and Substance Use Disorder Benefits
 - Both expansion of benefits and expansion of eligible populations
 - Cen Cal to administer new Medi-Cal benefits for mild to moderate conditions; County Mental Health continues as provider for severe mental health issues
 - County Drug and Alcohol Services to administer new substance use disorder services including intensive outpatient treatment, residential SUD services, medically necessary inpatient detox
 - New benefits and mental health parity also apply to small group and individual health plans

Local enrollment

- Department of Social Services reports (as of 1/13)
 - 2291 new approved Medi-Cal applications
 - 273 approved Covered CA applications - 80% subsidized
 - 1006 Medi-Cal applications pending verifications
 - 1500 pending Covered CA applications
- Cen Cal reports (as of 1/8)
 - 938 new ACA Medi-Cal enrollees
 - 843 adults; 40 children; 10 misc.
- Covered CA
 - No current report
- Lapse time between approval and enrollment

Observations

- Enrollment
 - The 3300 Medi-Cal applications have reached approximately 20% of estimated eligibles;
 - No data on Covered CA enrollment.
 - Open enrollment continues through March for Covered CA; all year for Medi-Cal
 - Not clear if reaching the "hard to reach" populations
- Provider networks
 - Anthem Provider Directory - not on line
 - Blue Shield directory - on line
 - Anecdotal reports differ from health plan lists

Observations

- What to look for in the future?
 - 6 month enrollment results
 - 3 year trajectory for full implementation
 - Reality of insurance - deductibles, formularies, etc.
 - Trends of shifting costs to consumers
 - Mental Health expansions
 - Satisfaction with insurance based system
 - Prevention and outcomes based reimbursement are key to reducing our current spending of \$2.8 trillion annually.
